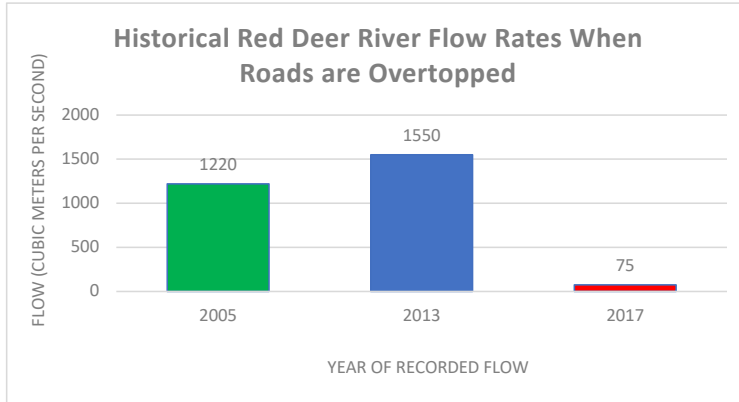

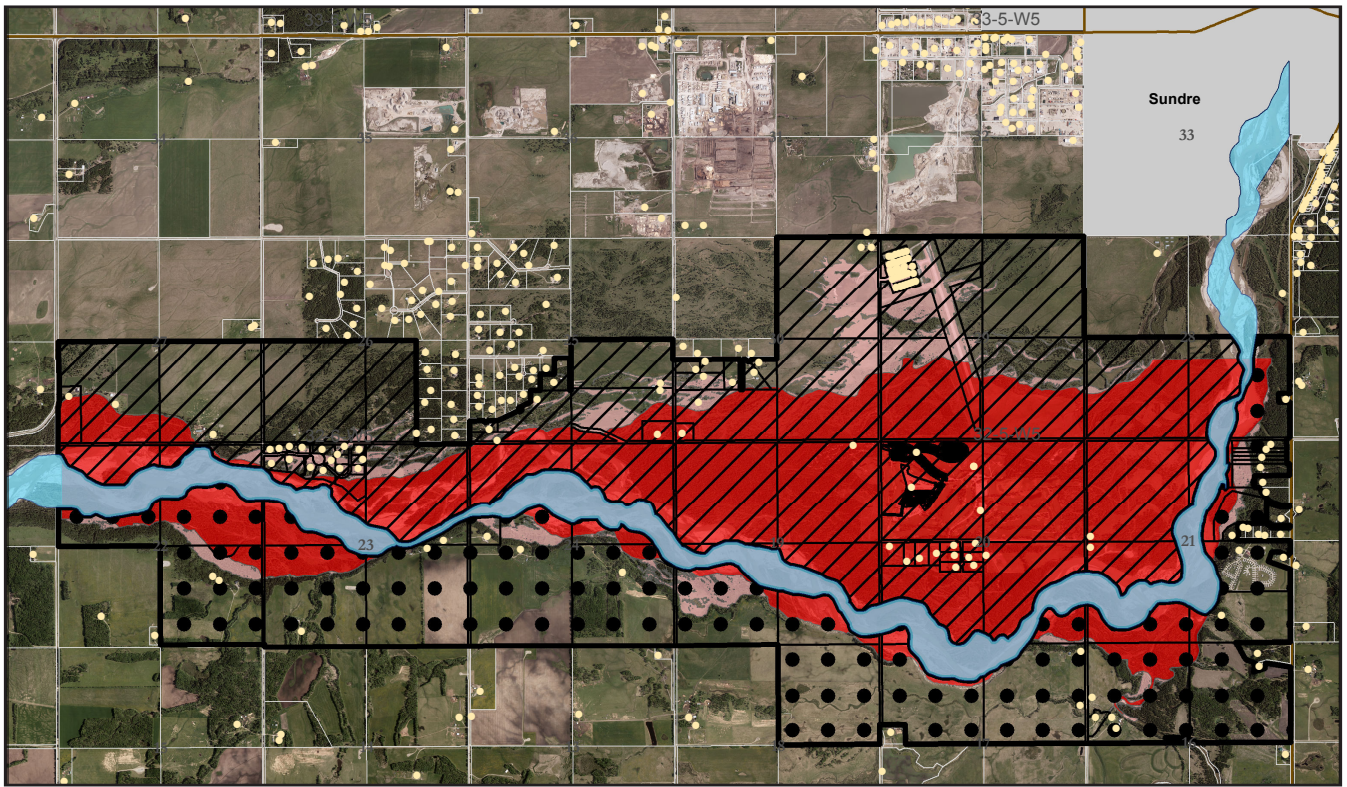

Monitor Red Deer River flows at Burnt Timber Creek and above the Panther River

- **Flow values approach 75 m³/s at either of these two stations and continue to rise residents should begin to voluntarily leave the area. Roads will begin to get overtopped by river water via the side channels.**
- **DO NOT WAIT FOR THE COUNTY TO TELL YOU TO LEAVE.** If you feel you are in danger leave the area
- At 75 m³/s begin to follow Mountain County on social media and local radio stations for important messaging.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS KITS

BE PREPARED TO BE SELF-SUFFICIENT FOR AT LEAST 72 HOURS

Make sure your kit is easy to carry and everyone in the household knows where it is.

Emergency Kit List

72-hour Kit

- Ready-to-eat and high-energy foods for three days
- Non-electric can opener
- Bottled water – at least 4 litres per person per day for three days
- Extra prescription medications
- Baby supplies, special needs items, etc.
- Lanterns, flashlights
- Battery-operated radios, batteries and alternative heat sources
- Extra warm clothing and blankets
- Cash and credit cards
- First aid kit

Travel Kit for Vehicle

- Flashlight and batteries
- Flares or reflective triangle
- First aid kit
- Basic tools including shovel
- Fully-charged cell phone
- Extra clothing, including hats and gloves in cool seasons
- Booster cables
- Sand or kitty litter
- Ice scrapper and brush in winter
- Blanket
- Non-perishable high-energy foods
- Drinking water
- Small candle in a tin can, waterproof matches

Evacuation Kit

Keep in a waterproof, easy-to-carry container that is easily accessible.

- Household Emergency Action Plan
- Travel toiletries bag including items like soap, hand sanitizer, personal and feminine hygiene products
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Prescription and non-prescription medications
- Non-perishable foods
- Non-electric can opener
- Bottled water
- Battery-operated radio
- Flashlights
- Extra batteries
- Extra clothes
- Cash and credit cards
- Personal I.D.
- Important documents (birth and marriage certificates, wills, passports, contracts)
- First aid kit
- Special needs items for baby, elderly, disabled, pets

Pet Kit for Evacuation

- Food and water for three days
- Disposable litter trays
(e.g. Aluminum roasting pan)
- Litter or paper towels
- Feeding dishes
- Extra leash / harness
- A traveling bag or sturdy carrier and blanket
- A photo of your pet
- Photocopies of medical records and a waterproof container with a two-week supply of any medicine your pet requires (check expiry dates)
- Copies of vaccination records, I.D. tags, medical and insurance information

PROPERTY RE-ENTRY POST FLOOD

Timelines for re-entry to properties post flood will depend on the conditions that exist in each area. The safety of the first responders and repair teams is the first priority. Access to flooded areas will not be allowed until the area has been deemed safe. **DO NOT ATTEMPT TO RE-ENTER AN EVACUATED AREA.** This will be enforced by the RCMP.

Re-Entry Plans will be communicated by the County once the area is safe. All updates and timelines will be posted on the Mountain View County Website www.mountainviewcounty.com. Hard copies of the re-entry plan will be made available and posted by the County for the public. These locations will be advertised prior to the release of the plans.

After an evacuation caused by a flood event re-entry to properties may be delayed or controlled. The protocols to enter the area's affected by flooding will be as follows:

- 1. Infrastructure Assessment and Repair teams.** These teams will go into affected areas to make sure all the roads are safe to travel, inspect power and gas services for damage.
- 2. Healthcare and Public Safety Assessment teams.** Alberta Health Services, Local Fire Safety Codes and other agencies may inspect properties for public safety prior to re-entry.
- 3. Phased Re-Entry.** Depending on damage assessments, access to property may be limited to day time hours, geographical areas or other restrictions
- 4. Full Re-Entry.**

When re-entering your property after a flood follow these tips:

- **HAVE A PHOTO ID WITH YOU PRIOR TO RE-ENTRY.** The RCMP or Peace Officers will require photo ID to ensure you are the owner of a property.
- Wear sturdy shoes when re-entering your property
- Watch for erosion on your property,
- Watch for loose or fallen down debris in your house and property
- Look for damage to electrical systems and gas lines services
- If power was lost to your property be prepared to throw out perishable food from your fridge, freezer and cupboards
