Rural/Civic addresses are required and must be displayed. Rural addressing allows 911 operators to help fire, ambulance and police find your home quickly in the event of an emergency. They can also be used for delivery of goods and services to your home.

Property Taxes are due, in full, by September 15th of the same year and the County has a monthly Tax Pre-Authorized Debit (PAD) program.

To avoid being charged under the **County Fire Bylaw** with the potential to be invoiced for the cost of the fire department call-out, please follow these steps:

- Obtain a County Fire Permit (March 1 to October 31) for ALL areas
- Determine if you live within the Forest Protection Area and obtain a burning permit from the Province of Alberta
- Determine if it is safe to burn.

Full or partial fire bans may be implemented by Mountain View County, Province of Alberta or surrounding municipalities.

Your insurance may not cover a claim for an accident if you do not have a building permit in place. **Building permits** are important to ensure that your construction meets provincial safety codes

At the **Agricultural Services** Shop the following services are offered:

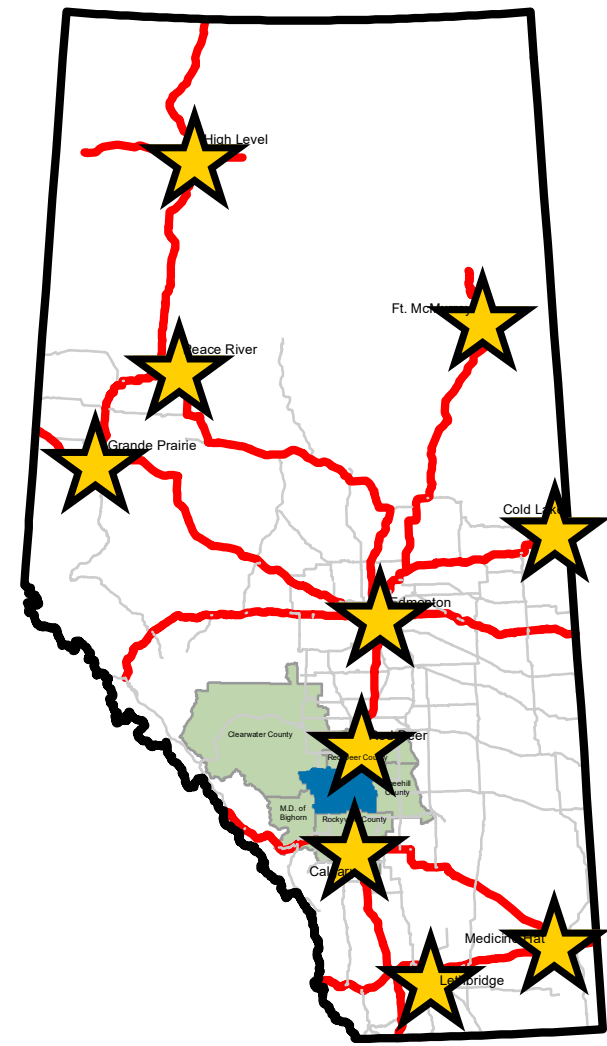
