# Canada Thistle Stem Mining Weevil Project Update

L. Grattidge updated the Board on the stem mining weevil. The first release of weevils happened at the Mountain View County Office in a fenced riparian area and the other site is located at the Kettle Crossing Farm NW of Bergen on a tributary in their farm. In July, the Grey Wooded Forage Association will stake out the 16 square meter plots at each location. There they will do a thistle plant count in order to establish a baseline for the weevils to come in September.

The monitoring process will take place over the course of five years.
