

When do I need a Building Permit?

Most construction projects including new builds and additions require both a Development Permit and a Building Permit. Depending on your project, you may also need Electrical, Gas, Plumbing, and/or Private Sewage permits.

You can submit your complete Building Permit application before your Development Permit is issued; however, the Building Permit cannot be issued until the Development Permit has been approved.

Building Permit Inspections

- The Applicant's Responsibilities
- Building Permit inspections can be requested through Mountain View County.
- For inspections related to Electrical, Gas, Plumbing, and Private Sewage (Septic) permits, please contact Superior Safety Codes directly.
- For any New Home Warranty inquiries, contact Alberta Municipal Affairs.

Important:

Under the Safety Codes Act, work must begin within 90 days of the permit being issued and must not be suspended for more than 120 days. If work stops for longer than this, or if the permit expires, you will need to reapply for a new Building Permit.

Take Note:

When applying for a Building Permit, you must include a copy of your New Home Warranty Certificate if you are:

- · Adding a dwelling, secondary suite, or prefabricated home, or
- Completing an addition where a warranty may be required.

National Energy Code Compliance Report:

This applies to most new construction and may also apply to additions. All commercial, industrial, and institutional buildings must comply with the National Energy Code of Canada for Buildings (2011).

All housing, additions, and small buildings must comply with Section 9.36 of the Alberta Building Code (2014).



Information for Building Permits

Mountain View County issues Building Permits under the Safety Codes Act. Building Permits ensure that all new construction meets the **Alberta Building Code**.

With your Building Permit application, you must submit **one set of blueprints** and an **electronic copy** of your Plans. If you do not have blueprints, staff can help you determine what details the inspector will require.

Additional information forms may be required for smaller projects such as **decks**, **garages**, **and additions**. These forms are available on our website at www.mountainviewcounty.com
